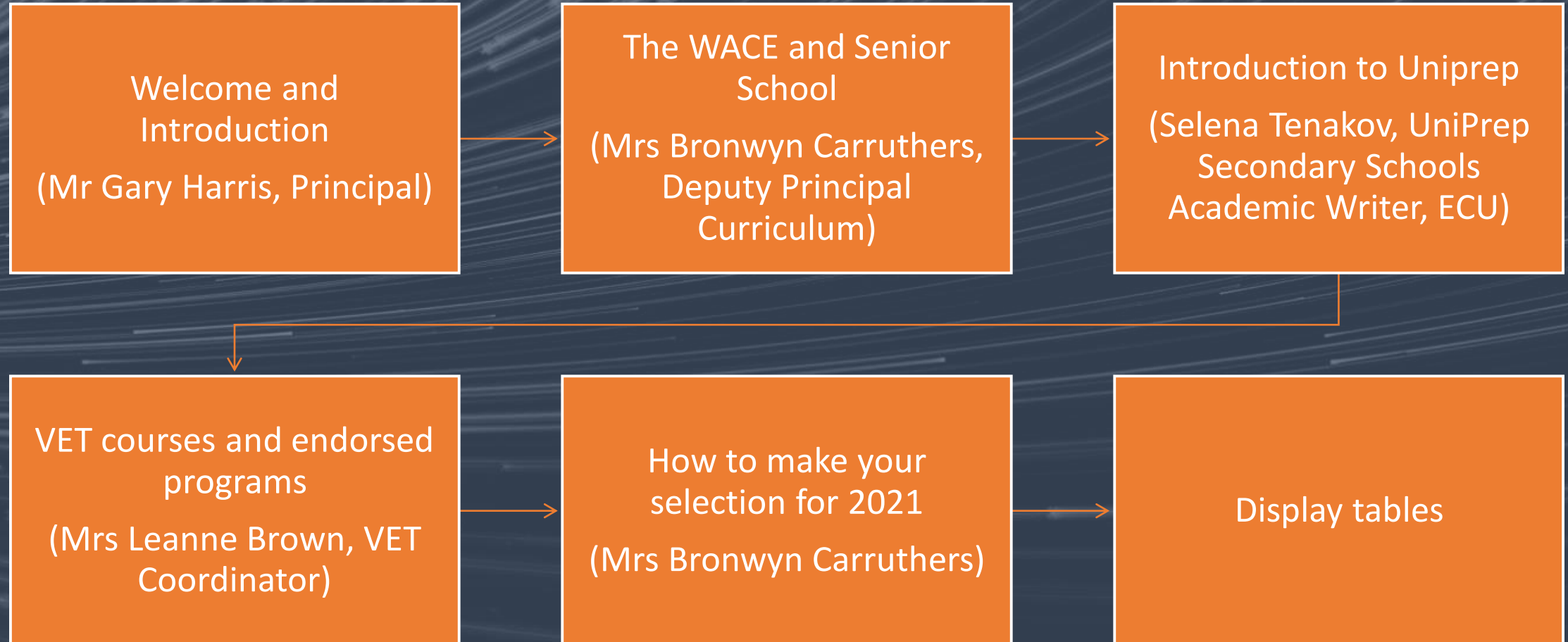

Organisation of Years 11 & 12



Students select 6 **courses** or **equivalents** to study in Year 11



In Year 12 one course can be dropped



Each course contains 2 Units, 1 per semester

Year 11 students study Units 1 & 2

Year 12 students study Units 3 & 4



Hours – each Unit involves 55 hours of class time per semester plus 3-4 hours per week out of school



WACE Requirements (WA Certificate of Education) Year 12 in 2022

Breadth-and-Depth

Completion of minimum of 20 Units or *equivalents* in Years 11 & 12

Completion of minimum of 10 Units or *equivalents* in Year 12

4 Units from *English courses*

1 Pair of English course units in Year 12

ATAR Courses

One of several pathways for students heading to University

Direct pathway from high school

Entry to university is based on the results from your 4 best ATAR courses which produces an ATAR

ATAR is a number which is a rank of where you sit in relation to every student in WA.

ATAR = Australian Tertiary Admission Rank

- Gives each student a rank between 0 and 99.95 relative to other Year 12 students in the state.
- If a student receives an ATAR of 70, the student achieved higher results than 70% of the students in their state
- Calculated by adding a student's combined scaled scores from their school and exam marks for their top 4 subjects and ranking this against the other students in the state.

General courses

These courses:

- are not externally examined
- have an externally set task (EST) which is set by the Authority
- are designed for students who are typically aiming to enter further vocationally based training or the workforce directly from school.

VET industry specific courses

These courses:

- include a full VET qualification and mandatory workplace learning
- contribute towards the WACE as course units
- qualifications undertaken through VET industry specific courses can be used to meet the Certificate II or higher requirement of the WACE
- the workplace learning component of the course contributes as unit equivalents towards the WACE.

Endorsed programs

These programs:

- provide access to areas of learning not covered by WACE courses or VET programs and contribute to the WACE as unit equivalents
- are for students wishing to participate in programs that are delivered in a variety of settings by schools, workplaces, universities and community organisations.

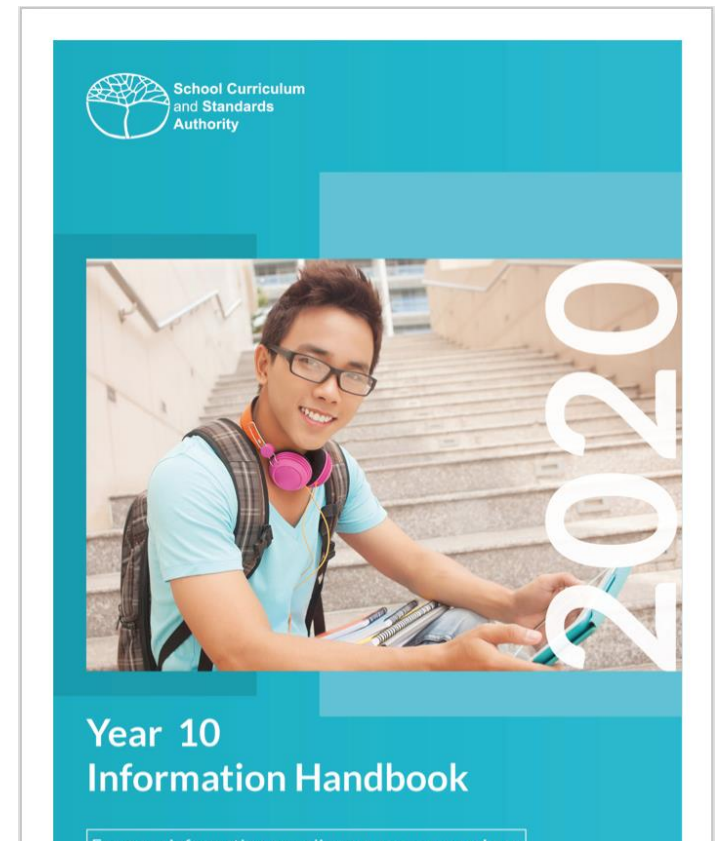
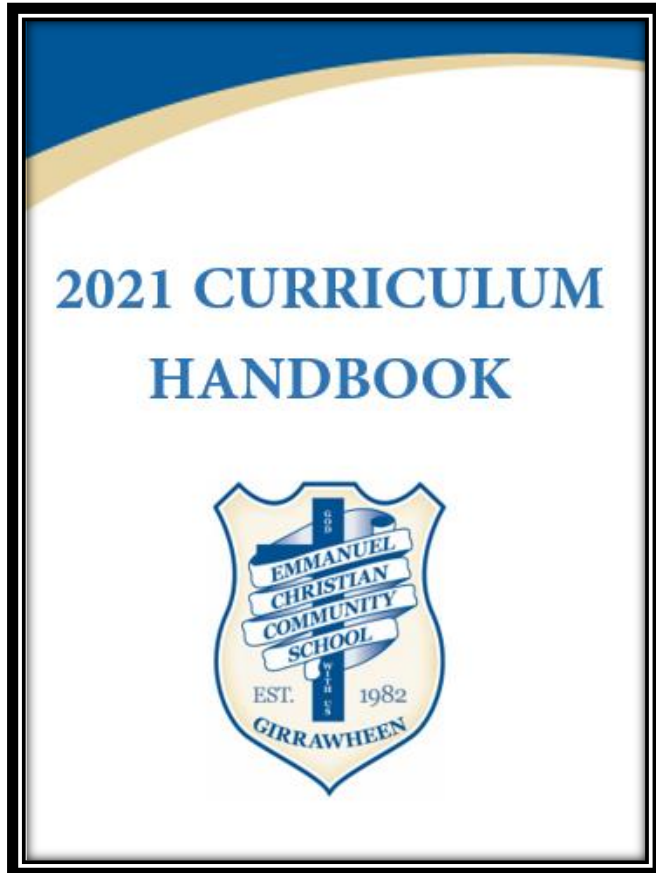

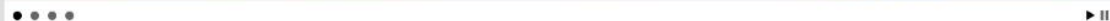
